Just spent an incredible couple of days relaxing and camping at Baandee Lake in Western Australia! This hidden gem is a salt lake, with little water at the moment, so no swimming, but the stark white landscape and surrounding bushland are unreal.

Perfect for a peaceful escape, or a rest up before hitting the Nullarbor.

There are plenty of spaces along the shoreline to park up, right by the lake's edge—free camping, no fees!



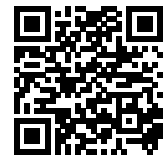
Enter via Sky Lake Road and not the brown tourist sign to Baandee off the Great Eastern Highway to avoid confusion.

The shire has provided several bins and they're emptied frequently.

Toilets and cold showers need TLC – oh, and brings some rubbish bags and some grabbers to clean up after the grubs.

There aren't any insect issues and we thought mozzies would quickly form a welcoming squadron – apart from hordes of flies attempting to crawl into every visible orifice (expected).

Great for birdwatching—saw heaps of galahs and wrens, the odd annoying crow and a few emus wandering nearby.



Tip: Bring water and supplies; it's remote, with Kellerberrin 20 mins away for essentials.

The Road in's gravel and needs grading but it's fine for caravans, even a slow 2WD would have no issues.
