The water flows underground, around 30 metres, and the water is visible on top of the sand about three times a year, after good rains upstream. So we don't think we'll be seeing it this time.

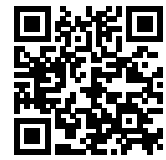
It reminds us of the Todd River in Alice Springs, just waiting for a boat race.
